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Dear Southwest Regional Participants:

We are thrilled you are going to be part of the NJSA Southwest Regional at the Oklahoma State Fairgrounds in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma on September 17th- September 20th! To make this event run smoothly, please read a few reminders listed below.

General Reminders

1. All Southwest Regional entries **must** have been owned by the exhibitor on or before August 12, 2026.
2. **The size of one pen is 5' x 10' and there will be TWO pigs per pen.** Please bring your own dividers they will NOT be provided for you.
3. We will **NOT** be providing shavings. Exhibitors will be responsible for their own. Shavings will be available for purchase at the fairgrounds.
4. NJSA age divisions are: Novice (8 & under); Junior (9-12); Intermediate (13-16); and Senior (17-21).
All ages are as of Jan. 1, 2026
5. Please visit the NSR website for health rules and regulations that **MUST** be followed for your pig to be exhibited.
6. EYO will be handling all penning assignments and will pen by state, because of this we are unable to accept any pen requests.

Arrival and Check-In Information

1. Entries may begin arriving at the fairgrounds at 5-8pm Wednesday, September 16th, and must be in place by 10:00 a.m. on Friday September 18th. Make sure all health papers are checked for all animals on your trailer by the veterinarians before you unload any hogs from your trailer.
2. Show check-in will take place from 4 – 6 p.m. on Thursday, September 17th; as well as Friday September 18th 8 a.m-10:00 am.
3. At check-in, each exhibitor should have the original pedigree and one photocopy of the pedigree for each hog, the original health paper and one photocopy of their PQA Plus or YQCA certificate or card.
4. **PLEASE DO NOT MAKE COPIES OF YOUR HEALTH PAPERS AHEAD OF TIME AS WE WILL REQUIRE THE VET TO SIGN YOUR ORIGINAL COPY UPON YOUR ARRIVAL. The copy that you turn in during registration MUST be signed by the vet.**
5. **All exhibitors ages 8 through 21 MUST be YQCA or PQA Plus certified.**
6. **Parents of youth ages 7 years and under must be certified in Adult PQA Plus training.**
7. Any youth that are not PQA Plus or YQCA certified prior to the Southwest Regional **will not be allowed to exhibit their hogs.**

Show Requirements

1. Barrows must weigh 290 pounds or less with a 15 lb. weigh-back. Crossbred gilts must weigh 375 pounds or less with a 15 lb. weigh-back.
2. This is not a terminal show; exhibitors will be responsible for their barrows at the completion of the show.

3. Scales will be available throughout event. At registration exhibitors will receive weigh cards with a QR code to scan to submit the weights of their barrows and crossbred gilts. Exhibitors must submit the declared weight of ALL purebred barrows, crossbred barrows and crossbred gilts those submission deadlines are as follows: Friday September 18th 2:00 PM Crossbred gilts, Saturday September 19th 8:00 AM all barrow weights.
4. The top three barrows and crossbred gilts in each class will be reweighed. Barrows and crossbred gilts must weigh back within 15 pounds of their declared weight. Any barrows or crossbred gilts weighing more or less than 15 pounds of the declared weight will be disqualified.
5. Showmanship will begin at 3:00 p.m. on Friday, September 18th, beginning with seniors, then intermediates, juniors, and novices.
6. NJSA Bred and Owned Gilt Show will begin at the conclusion of showmanship including the Grand and Reserve Bred and Owned Gilt overall.
7. The gilt show will begin at 12 p.m. Saturday, September 19th, starting with the Crossbred, followed by Berkshire, Chester Whites, Durocs, Hampshire, Hereford, Landrace, Poland China, Spotted, Tamworth, Yorkshire. With the gilt grand drive to follow starting with Grand Team Purebred Gilt and following with the NJSA Grand gilt drive.
8. The barrow show will begin at 8 a.m. Sunday, September 20th, starting with the Berkshires, followed by Chester Whites, Durocs, Hampshire, Hereford, Landrace, Poland China, Spotted, Tamworth, Yorkshire, and Crossbred barrow. With the barrow grand drive to follow starting with Grand Team Purebred barrow and following with the NJSA Grand barrow drive.
9. The National Swine Registry Executive Committee has voted to implement the weighing of ALL junior purebred gilts. All exhibitors will be required to go to one of the designated scales in the barn for breed eligibility checks and be weighed by NSR staff members during the designated time as posted on the schedule. Weight cards will be obtained at check-in and turned in once the gilt is weighed at the scale.
10. Junior purebred gilt classes will be broken first by month of birth, then by weight within month of birth. All purebred gilts will be weighed on Friday, September 18th from 10am- noon.

Skillathon Information

1. Skillathon will begin at 8 a.m. on Saturday September 18th and will conclude at 11 am. All exhibitors must be checked into skillathon by 10:30 a.m.
2. The skillathon review will be from 11:30 a.m to 11:50 a.m. on Saturday, September 18th.

Sweepstakes

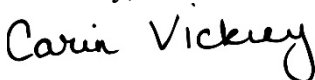
1. Sweepstakes contest points will be awarded in the purebred gilt/barrow shows, showmanship contest and skillathon contest. Youth must compete in showmanship, skillathon, and either the gilt show or barrow show to qualify for the sweepstakes contest. The exhibitor's highest placing purebred barrow OR purebred gilt will count toward the sweepstakes contest, NOT both. All participants in the sweepstakes contest MUST complete the entire skillathon contest.
2. The sweepstakes award ceremony will take place at the conclusion of the barrow show on Sunday.
